Disabled American Veterans Brings Message to FINA-CAF AIRSHO®

MIDLAND, TEXAS – The Disabled American Veterans (DAV) will bring its message of service and volunteerism in support of our nation’s combat-wounded men and women to FINA-CAF AIRSHO 2007 on Sept. 29 and 30, 2007

As part of a 20-airshow tour, the DAV will bring its timely and patriotic message on the wings of *Special Delivery*, a fully-restored B-25 Mitchell Bomber owned by the Lone Star Flight Museum. Throughout the day, DAV representatives will be on hand and ready to meet, greet and answer questions about veteran’s benefits.

The Disabled American Veterans, representing more than 1.3 million disabled veterans, is a non-profit organization founded in 1920 and chartered by Congress in 1932. It is dedicated to one, single purpose: building better lives for our nation’s disabled veterans and their families.

Near the B-25, the veteran’s service organization will have a Mobile Service Office staffed with VA claims experts ready to provide assistance and answer questions for the veterans in attendance. Information on the DAV’s extensive Voluntary Service Network will also be available to let those interested know how to get involved in providing assistance to disabled veterans.

“The DAV is thrilled to bring our message of volunteerism and support to our nation’s sick and disabled veterans to this air show,” said DAV National Commander Robert T. Reynolds. “We believe the men, women and children who will visit this airshow are the patriotic, military-friendly citizens who have helped make this nation so great.
